Subsequently it has developed into one of finest institutes imparting the laparoscopic surgery to postgraduate students.
- I was member of a team which were the first to perform kidney transplants in Pune I went to UK on JN Tata Endowment Fellowship to learn it further and took institute in cadaveric transplant programme
- Started Video conferencing for international clinical meetings, faculty interactions and training programmes in tuberculosis conducted.
- Telemedicine programme successfully implemented for treating rural patients.
- Computerization and networking of all hospital and college.


## (2)(i) Managerial Skills: Event Anticipation \& Strategic Planning

$\Rightarrow$ My Managerial role in Swine flu epidemic as Dean BJMC Pune

- During Swine flu epidemic Sassoon hospital started its first Isolation ICU with Ventilator arrangement within 4 days of first Patient reported in Pune.
- We were ready with that First facility by that time First Pt was wheeled in
- We planned for further management all over Pune by training all Doctors from Public health. Involved all Hospitals in Pune and took their help in creating ICUs and IIWs in Pune that was Public Private Model of Pune
- We worked as a" Think tank". Contributed in changing GOI guidelines , viz. drug regimens, Ventilator protocols etc.
$\Rightarrow$ Anticipating water shortage in RCSM Govt Medical College Kolhapur campus got a sanction of Rs. 1.8 crores from District planning commission for separate Pipe line. The work is in progress now
- Understanding that patient care can only be improved if we have PG education in this college, personal efforts were made and PG courses in 11 disciplines were started in Kolhapur.
- Anticipating shortage of space at Shenda Park campus, Kolhapur, personally tried to procure land from Dy. Director of Leprosy from Leprosy Hospital.
$\Rightarrow$ Pune Model of Swine flu management was end result of this ability. I was able to convince 14 hospitals in Pune to start Isolation wards and respiratory ICUs. As a net result 243 bed and 45 ventilators were available. All Health care providers in Pune District, PMC, PCMC, Cantonment Boards, Civil Surgeon and Rural Hospitals, DHO with all PHCs, School Health authorities were the stake holders in swine flu management. All were taken into main flow and the better swine flu
management was the result.
$\Rightarrow$ District Adoption Plan was conceptualized with 5 medical colleges to deliver expert service at rural hospitals in Pune. Pune district was divided into five zones and each medical college looking after two talukas coordination done with six rural hospitals with Civil Surgeon and DHO with all PHCs as feeder. The scheme is being implemented from 1st May 2010.
$\Rightarrow$ Pune Model of disaster management plan being implemented with 16 hospitals in Pune with an aim to reach medical relief at disaster site within 20 minutes.


## (2)(ii) Managerial Skills: Resource Generation \& Allocation

- We need to have tremendous fiscal control to see that we get supply till the end and we have to try very seriously at all levels to get more money under this head
- We indeed try very hard to generate revenue for patient care at all levels and we are getting this year funds from CF Contingency funds from government


## Industry Funding

Untapped sources are from industry. Health sector industry of 2 types could be tapped for this purpose.

1) Instrument manufacturing companies 2) Pharmaceutical companies.

- Instrument manufacturing companies can sponsor Ph.D. programmes or postgraduate dissertation programmes.
- We need to encourage Ph.D. programmes in various disciplines that could use such fundings for devising new instruments or modifying instruments for Indian scenario.
- New ideas in instrument design could be tapped and those could be developed into reality by industry sponsorship e.g. My Ph.D. student has devised a volume priority CO2 insufflator. It has been patented by under Indian Patent.
- Such Ideas should be explored. All faculties utilizing such equipment will definitely have new ideas for better patient management.
- Pharmaceutical industries in India after GATT agreement need to conduct independent clinical trial. Abundant number of patients in public hospitals affiliated to medical colleges could be used for this purpose.


## International Funding

- Funding is available across the globe; the funds could be made available for doing research from National Institute of Health, European Union of Research etc. This will not only ensure high quality of research but also contribute to the financial stability of the University.
- Collaboration with foreign universities is another source of revenue generation. UoM can set up 'off campus' centre and conduct examinations for foreign universities to generate money. Student exchange programme could also be another source of income for the university.

## (3) Alignment with Corporate Objectives, State \& National Priorities

(i) Ability to identify the needs of the communities in key sectors

We have large population in rural areas which do not get effective higher Education. There is urgent need to increase General Enrolment Rate (GER) in higher education by reducing drop outs.

For Education system to produce graduates with desired employment, we need to strategically focus on "Education Modules with Enhanced Employability". We must design various modules for a subject which would be adaptable to the students' aptitude and skills desired. The curricular reforms have to be more need-base, skilloriented and in alignment with latest developments in technology.

Mumbai city is Economic Capital of India, according to 'World Economic Forum' which judges an economy's competitiveness. About five measuring parameters of economy's competitiveness are related to 'Education System'. Thus 'Quality Education' is essential for economic development of India.

I wish to inculcate innovative culture of 'Customized Education' as per needs of an individual (society, market \& students) [ $\mathrm{N}=1$ ] by finding best resources globally [ $R=G$ ] for commercial \& industrial development .

An ambitious project of adoption of district in the state by different medical colleges who would travel on site and provide tertiary care on fixed days, was launched.

As Dean, B.J. Medical College, I co-ordinated this project in Pune District and motivated the private medical colleges viz.

- Bharati Vidyapeeth Medical College,
- MIMER medical college, Talegaon,
- Dr. DY Patil Medical College and
- Armed Forces Medical College
to participate in it. Each medical college is given 2 talukas.
The same model could be upscaled for the state and a vision to provide tertiary care
at the site by the medical colleges could be developed.


## (ii) Deep understanding of the challenges before the nation and how Higher Education can respond to developmental needs

First challenge the University has to face is the shortage of skilled human resources. Skill enhancement through Customized education is essential.

1. I have tried to improve equality in medical education by introducing faculty development workshops in education, established separate department of Medical education and appointed first Professor of Medical education.
2. Introduced communication skills $\mathbb{\&}$ values in medical education in the curriculum of health sciences under the University for improvement of "Doctor-Patient Relationship"
3. Various fellowship courses for generation of subspecialty expertise for the benefit of society developed. This was an brave attempt to get corporate sector medical institute in main stream medical education. Around 90 courses are conducted in more than $\mathbf{5 0}$ major hospitals in Maharashtra
4. I was instrumental in introducing 'Master's Degree in Health Professions Education (MHPE), with the help of faculty in the US and India, with financial assistance under Obama-Singh 21st Century Knowledge Initiative, a collaborative project between Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and University of Michigan.
5. I have introduced 13 vocational courses under the aegis of Bachelor of Paramedical Technology at B.J. Medical College. These will be job oriented courses for weaker sections of the Society.
6. Understanding the health care needs of the population, as a Dean BJMC started distant education courses in geriatrics and Maternal and Child Health under the flagship of Indira Gandhi National Open University. I contributed actively in the curriculum development of these courses after consultation with Janet Grant, Director of British National Open University.
7. Those fellowship courses in Geriatrics, were continued under MUHS

## (iii) Demonstrable understanding of curriculum development issues, especially those relating to widening participation and social inclusion

1) As a Vice-Chancellor of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik I have taken following initiatives
1.1 Introduced competency based curriculum in MUHS,
1.2.Started more than 100 Fellowship Courses on credit point system.
1.3 Pioneer in India for initiating competency based curriculum in Ayurved.
1.4 Included of bioethics in Health Sciences curriculum.
1.5 MBA Healthcare: Initiated unique programme in Health Care administration which is entirely conducted by experts in various domains of mamnagement for the Health Professionals.
2) As a Chairman of Board of Studies in Surgery, I was instrumental in developing curriculum of all subjects under the Board namely Surgery, ENT, Orthopedics, Ophthalmology. The curriculum was very much appreciated as it was encompassing all domains (cognitive, psychomotor and affective). It was complete exploration of ideas given by Medical Council of India and to be implemented by MUHS. The whole syllabus is still considered as an ideal by academic council and then Vice Chancellor Dr. Dongaonkar.
3) We redeveloped syllabus for postgraduate examination in all above subjects as per model of Rajiv Gandhi Medical University. However, it was not implemented as affiliation of postgraduate courses was deferred. However, next Board of Studies used it after requisite modifications.
4) As a Chairman, Board of Studies, I devised a totally new curriculum for internship programme. It was accepted by series of meetings with academic council and faculty after extensive brainstorming. The highlighting fact was MUHS was first to introduce psychomotor skill evaluation after each posting.
5) As a member of Ad-hoc Superspeciality Board, I was instrumental in developing for MCH Urology which was implemented subsequently.
6) I have reasonable competence as regards developing syllabus and curriculum in University level.
7) I was instrumental in modifying examination system and making it more objective. Introduction of SAQs and MCQs in the evaluation process is the end result of this activity.

As the Dean, BJ Medical College, I have experienced the need of motivating a diverse group of stakeholders for efficient running of the hospital. These include doctors, nurses, paramedical staff, support staff such as ward boys and sweepers, ancillary staff viz. kitchen staff including dieticians, linen and laundry staff.

NGOs have been motivated to work closely with us for the benefit of the Institute. These are Aniruddha Bapu Foundation, Jeevan Jyot and SOFOSH. With the help of these organizations we have arranged better management of patients' traffic in the casualty, help to transport the patients from the casualty to the respective area where they are admitted, better management of our burns ward and pediatric ward.

Around 32 committees have been constituted involving group of stakeholders.

- Pune Model of Swine flu management was end result of this ability. I was able to convince 14 hospitals in Pune to start Isolation wards and respiratory ICUs. As a net result 243 bed and 45 ventilators were available. All Health care providers in Pune District, PMC, PCMC, Cantonment Boards, Civil Surgeon and Rural Hospitals, DHO with all PHCs, School Health authorities were the stakeholders in swine flu management. All were taken into main flow and the better swine flu management was the result.
- Management of German Bakery Blast patients across 6 hospitals was another example.
- District Adoption Plan was organized with 5 medical colleges to deliver expert service at rural hospitals in Pune. Pune district was divided into five zones and each medical college looking after two talukas co-ordination done with six rural hospitals with Civil Surgeon and DHO with all PHCs as feeder. The scheme is being implemented from Ist May 2010.
- Pune Model of disaster management plan being implemented with 16 hospitals in Pune with an aim to reach medical relief at disaster site within 20 minutes.


## ii) Keen desire to further the mission and goals of organization.

(1) Because of my keen interest in academics I undertook fulltime teaching job in government medical college. So far I have gathered 32 years experience of teaching, research and administration in various capacities. During my career I have seen closely the needs in medical education and health sector. Thus I have developed a dream to serve at university level to fulfill these needs for
the state. This keen interest has prompted me to apply for this post of Vice Chancellor.
(2) Main purpose of health science institutes is to offer better quality of life to all human kind. They need to be healthy for better development of creative talent and critical thinking
(3) Creation and maintenance of health of population is goal to achieve. Healthy people create wealth and in turn prosper the nation healthy people are the one, who protect nation.
(4) Control of infectious diseases, nutritional diseases and affective natural control of degenerative diseases with best of talents expertise and innovation in all pathies need to be done. Creation of a holistic doctor, who suits the needs of Indian health, is a dream that needs to come true.
(5) Technology in medicine has revolutionized overall management of patient and is responsible for quality health care. It is costly and university needs to exert to see that it comes within reach of poor.
(6) Educational goals : BJMC Pune in top 10 of the medical colleges.
(7) Undergraduate result more than $90 \%$.
(8) Postgraduate result more than $90 \%$
(9) Upgradation of infrastructural facility for students
(10) Administrative goals : efficient management of fiscal provisions as elaborated elsewhere.

## (iii) Ability to think strategically and innovatively and maintain a broad perspective

- Since my student days I have inquisitive mind. My topic of Dissertation was very innovative on "Immunosensitised Porcine cell infusion in Ca maxilla", Later I added Transfer factor in my research project.
- After my post graduation degree though being in surgical subject, ।
undertook PhD work on innovative topic with innovative methodology and completed it. This spirit reflects in my academic career so far. My research in the project of 'Acute pain in abdomen', my work in the Board of Studies in the University, my innovations like Jamkar's knotting technique, and my guidance to the student in developing new equipment and patenting are indicative of this spirit.
- When the first death due to Swine Flu occurred in Pune city public and administration had panic reaction. No body had experience to handle such acute airborne fast spreading fatal disease. I could make a successful strategy of overnight creating the Intensive Care Unit for Swine Flu in the general hospital campus with necessary norms and precautions instead of the designated infectious disease hospital which had no facilities and expert health manpower. This strategy became successful and critical patients from remote areas started pouring in and we could manage them. Government took note of it. Additional Chief Secretary of the Govt. and Minister personally appraised it and Govt. has continued this arrangement even today.
- This strategy was later extended by incorporating chain of private hospitals by having dialogue with them and giving the training. This 'Pune Model' was later taken as prototype for implementation in the country.
- Right from the first day I took charge as the Dean, I am working with strategy of future development. Milestones like renovation of Obstetrics \& Gynaecology Operation Theatre first, then that of Orthopaedic OT, MRI, procurement of many equipments, planning and start of construction of new Sassoon Hospital building to the latest submission of proposal of upbringing this college to the status of AIIMS are indicative of the broadened perspective of the strategy I decided.
- Administrative reforms through BDS and HMIS.
- Surgical innovations : laparoscopy, renal transplant.
- Video conferencing and telemedicine for research and patient care.
- Strategic suggestions for disaster management plan and its implementation being exemplified by its implementation during "German Bakery Blast".

 to new ideas and a consultative approach in implementation of the same- I am quite computer savvy and can use information technology to leverage efficiencies on a tremendous scale in my day to day work in a goal oriented manner. Technology can be used as a backbone of Institutional activities along with modern educational innovations /strategic interventions.
- Can order any IT professional to create necessary infrastructure needed for Healthcare Environment including virtual learning environments .data mining /manipulation. Application of technology for benefit of students including wi-fi campus and online examinations
- Laparoscopic surgery was introduced in 1990. I was ready to accept it. Sassoon Hospital got first of video laparoscope from Fujinon on donation. I learnt the technique myself and we were pioneer in developing the skills at Sassoon General Hospital. Subsequently it has developed into one of finest institutes imparting the laparoscopic surgery to postgraduate students.
- Started palliative surgery OPD, carcinoma breast OPD and Laparoscopic surgery OPD at Sassoon Hospital, when experts in the field came to me and wanted to serve the poor patients.
- I was member of a team which were the first to perform kidney transplants in Pune I went to UK on JN Tata Endowment Fellowship to learn it further and took institute in cadaveric transplant programme

Worked with a Human right group to issue free food for relatives in the campus of Sassoon Hospital.
